With the measure of consistency and collaboration as a delegate of the Public Health department, White River Health District will be adhering to the published Oregon Health Authority (OHA) Immunization Program Protocols.

All protocols are online with the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) and collaborate with Center for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines. For purposes of approval of this policy attached is the Table of Contents with the current updated renewal date as well as all the protocols this policy will cover for Immunizations including adverse reactions, Immunization injection site for administration.

Clinic Manager and/or Medical Director will review protocols with Oregon Health Authority (OHA) on a quarterly basis to verify if an updated version is available for the clinic protocol manual. Any changes will automatically be implemented upon receiving notification of changes from CDC or OHA.
